
Memorandum

To: Cadets, Parents, and Staff of the Chicago Military Academy at Bronzeville
From: Mr. Miller, Academy Superintendent
Date: 3 February 2010
RE: Personal Electronic Devices

This Memorandum is to clarify technical confusion regarding cadet possession and/or use of personal electronic devices at the Chicago Military Academy at Bronzeville. As stated in the Cadet Handbook for School Year 2009/2010, use of these items is strictly prohibited. They are not to be carried on a cadet's person at any time during the school day, 6:30am to 4:00pm. Paragraph G.9 of the Cadet Handbook is to be replaced as follows:

Electronic Devices. Use of personal electronic devices, including but not limited to beepers, radios, lasers, game players and personal audio/visual devices (MP3, iPod, earbud, etc.), like cell phones, is strictly prohibited in the building during school hours (6:30am – 4:00pm). Any such device brought into the building is subject to confiscation by Academy staff. If brought to school, personal electronic devices must be turned off and placed in the locker upon entry to the building. They are not to be used in the dining facility at any time. Students in violation of this policy will be disciplined. The first violation will result in confiscation of the device for seven (7) days and a parent/guardian must pick up the device after seven (7) days. A second violation will result in an out-of-school suspension. A second violation by a cadet, whether the device is the same or a different device (including cell phones), will result in confiscation until the last day of the school year. This policy is subject to change at any time if the Academy administration deems it is in the best interest of the Academy.

This policy is effective immediately.
